




## PARTICIPANT NUMBERS + DEMOGRAPHICS






Ethnicity	Percentage

#### **Engaged More Kids Than Ever Before**


God has continued to provide the resources, community members, volunteers, finances, and partnerships to increase the number of kids served through RBI Austin.




